The distraction will slow down your revision and make it far less effective.

- Lesson arrangements: You attend all lessons until the exam in the subject has taken place. The other exception is that if you have an exam in the morning you don't have to attend school the afternoon before it and if you have an exam in the afternoon you don't have to attend in the morning. You may decide you want to come to school, if there is a relevant revision session, but you don't have to. Tutorial period is not on now until after the exams. However, your tutors will be in the bases if you need somewhere quiet to revise. Enrichment is only on for GCSE Maths and English.
- Exam timetables: please check yours carefully and if you notice that there is anything missing or shouldn't be on because, for instance, you have dropped the subject, please see Mrs Booth – any exam clashes please see the Exams Officer.

Grammar schools given £50 million

Theresa May's gift to grammar schools was branded an elitist move that helps only a small number of brighter pupils but leaves countless others languishing behind



The cash will go to expanding 163 selective schools after the government's bid to build more was scuppered when Theresa May lost her majority at the election

Grammar schools today get a £50million Tory handout as comprehensives suffer cuts.

But furious union leaders said the money should be going to those crippled by Tory cuts, where heads have had to ask parents for help to buy books, pens and glue.

The PM today hands out the cash to expand 163 selective schools. It is feared the move will widen the gap between poor and rich pupils and scupper social mobility hopes.

National Education Union joint general secretary Kevin Courtney said: “The grammar school corpse has climbed out of its coffin once again despite evidence of the damage that selective education causes. Schools up and down the country are desperately short of funds.

“This is money that would be better invested in ensuring all schools could provide for their pupils without having to ask for money from parents.

“Selective education systems are also linked with greater inequality in social outcomes later in life.”

Nick Brook, deputy general secretary of school leaders’ union the NAHT, added: “The Government cannot point to a single piece of evidence that shows educational benefit of this misguided policy. While it may benefit a small minority, it will not close the gap between rich and poor pupils.

“The state-funded school system is heading towards insolvency. To pursue such an elitist policy as this is a - distraction at best.”

Education Secretary Damian Hinds claimed expanding grammar schools will give parents “more choice”.

He added: “We can give children of all backgrounds access to a world-class education.” To get a share of the funding, grammars will have to prove they can boost numbers of disadvantaged pupils.

Funding will also be provided to create new voluntary aided schools, run with local council help, if there is demand.

The move comes as 500 head teachers wrote to Mrs May to demand the reversal of £3billion cuts because they are damaging pupils' educations and futures.

Unions warn the school funding crisis is bigger than the NHS crisis.


Futures decided by an exam at 11

Grammar schools are state-funded secondary schools that select pupils by an exam taken by primary school children, known as the "11-plus".

There are around 160 grammars in England, out of 3,000 state secondaries.

Only a handful of local authorities in England have kept selective schools systems, including Kent, Medway, Buckinghamshire and Lincolnshire,
