

News items of the week......as we mark the 25th anniversary of the killing of Stephen Lawrence on a London street another innocent young man dies.

Gun violence on London's streets 'must stop'



Rhyhiem Ainsworth Barton was "trying

to make a difference" by learning to work with children, his mother said

The mother of a 17-year-old boy who was killed over the weekend has called for an end to violence on London's streets.

"Let my son be the last and be an example to everyone. Just let it stop," said Pretana Morgan, whose son Rhyhiem was shot in Southwark on Saturday.

The teenager was one of five people shot in the capital over the bank holiday weekend.

Home Secretary Sajid Javid said serious violence was "robbing too many young people of their futures".

In Wealdstone, three people, including two boys aged 13 and 15, were injured, and a 22-year-old was shot in Lewisham.

The 13-year-old was believed to be an "innocent bystander", police said.
